- 818.** 1943 Perth Proof Penny, George VI. *Couple of small spots. Red/Purple reverse and toned obverse. Rare.* aFDC \$6,750-10,000



- 819.** 1945 Perth Proof Penny, George VI. *Couple of small spots. Red/Purple reverse & toned obverse. Rare.* aFDC \$7,500-10,000



- 820.** 1948 Perth Proof Halfpenny, George VI. *Rare. Dark tone with attractive purple highlights otherwise FDC* \$7,000-10,000



- 821.** 1950 Proof Halfpenny, George VI. *Rare. Dark tone with patches of some streaky lustre.* aFDC. \$5,000-7,000



- 822.** 1951 PL Proof Sixpence, George VI. *Superb original proof & Very Rare.* Brilliant FDC \$9,000-10,000
